The R.O.S.E. Scholarships provide individuals with the tools to help them regain their self-esteem through college education and continuing education grants.

- 1. The R.O.S.E. Scholarship at UMASS Boston:** The R.O.S.E. Fund annually awards scholarships to accepted UMASS Boston students who are women survivors of domestic violence and have a proven record of college success and who are or will be enrolled in a minimum of 9 credits per semester.
- 2. The R.O.S.E. Continuing Education Grants:** The R.O.S.E. Continuing Education Grants range from \$200 to \$1000 per individual and must be used towards education or work related training to support women who have broken the cycle of domestic violence.
- 3. The R.O.S.E. Scholarship at Pine Manor College:** The R.O.S.E. Fund annually awards scholarships to accepted Pine Manor College students who are survivors of domestic violence and have a proven record of success and who are or will be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credits per semester.
- 4. Cooking and Nutrition Workshop Series:** In September 2003 the R.O.S.E. Fund implemented a new Cooking and Nutrition Workshop Series to teach women valuable life skills. The workshop offers participants a support system while educating them about healthy, low cost and easy to prepare dishes.

1. **Career Development Grants** are provided to women who hold a bachelor's degree and are preparing to advance their careers, change careers, or re-enter the work force. Special consideration is given to AAUW members, women of color and women pursuing their first advanced degree or credentials in non-traditional fields.
2. **Continuing Education Fellowships and Grants** are provided to women for educational, project and professional support, as well as for post-baccalaureate study or research in the U.S. Some awards allow for study in a country other than the applicant's own.
3. **American Fellowships** provide support to women doctoral candidates completing dissertations or scholars seeking funds for post-doctoral research leave from accredited institutions. The program offers three awards: **Post-Doctoral Research Leave Fellowships**, **Dissertation Fellowships** and the **Summer/Short-Term Research Publication Grants**.
4. **International Fellowships** are only available for full-time study or research to women who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents, and who have earned the equivalent of a U.S. bachelor's degree by September 1, 2005. Graduate and postgraduate study at accredited institutions are supported.
